Comcast is having a bad month. Since early April, the company has had to defend itself against a rash of public outrage over its NBCUniversal merger with Time Warner Cable. The company was caught off-guard when it was revealed that it paid the National Security Agency at least \$11.7 million for access to an Internet connection, including a network of servers where the company collected and held information on customers.

NBCUniversal has also faced the high-profile removal of The Biggest Loser from the NBCUniversal-owned cable channel Bravo, and those who watch the program have noticed that there is no Biggest Loser. advertisement advertisement Since late March, Comcast has taken it upon itself to assure the American public that it never records or stores any information

on individual subscribers — including whether or not they are paying their bills. Comcast was able to offer a fairly detailed retraction after it was revealed that Comcast stores data on what websites people are visiting, at least as far back as 2014. But the company's claims, given in a new letter to Senator Richard Blumenthal of Connecticut, seem to fall flat in light of the fact that it is alleged to have accessed subscriber data from the venture between British intelligence service GCHQ and the Internet provider BT, which it inherited via the NBCUniversal deal. At issue is a program dubbed Signals, which according to a New York Times report from last June is a UK-based “major intelligence project aimed at sifting through huge amounts of data about individuals’ Internet activities.” Some of that information is collected by government agencies like the NSA and the UK’s GCHQ, the Times noted, and “comprises information about people’s use of computers, mobile phones and other devices, including the searches they conduct on the internet.” BT and its partner, GCHQ, have long denied that data is ever stored on European soil. As recently as March, BT asserted that Signals is not connected to any of the major telecoms in the UK. It has also maintained that it is perfectly legal and aboveboard for the company to maintain records of subscriber traffic, but not data collected 2d92ce491b
